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Summary

Areas likely to result in significant cost implications for Wiltshire College are identified below.

- Excessive expenditure on raw materials
- Environmental discharge consents
- Waste handling and storage
- Waste disposal including landfill tax
- Waste companies fees for illegal co-disposal
- Need to remove contaminants from skips
- Energy bills
- Vermin control costs
- Decontamination costs
- Water bills
- Flooding – direct costs, and future protection measures
- Adaptation to Global Warming
- Hazardous waste disposal
- Dealing with complaints
- Dealing with protests (animal keeping)
- Maintenance of Local Exhaust Ventilation
- Cleaning up oil leaks
- Publicity following oil leaks
- Damage to sewerage facilities resulting in their loss
- Emergency generator hire
- Emergency sewerage system hire
- Loss of letting business should energy or sewerage system fail or be closed down by the authorities
- Travel costs (staff)
- Delays to find parking space
- Disposal of waste electrical and electronic equipment
- Contaminate land survey, maintenance, clean-up and effect on land values
- Student fees (reputational risk)
- OFSTED criticism; awarding body status.
